



Toronto Cricket, Skating & Curling Club Selected to Host Canadian Doubles Squash Championship

OTTAWA, ON, August 19, 2016 – It was announced today that the Toronto Cricket, Skating & Curling Club (TCSCC) has been selected by Squash Canada to host the 2017 Canadian Doubles Championship March 30 to April 1, 2017.

The TCSCC has a long standing history of hosting incredible events, as they have hosted provincial and national championships numerous times over the years. Under the leadership of Head Squash Professional, Patrick Ryding, the TCSCC boasts world-class viewing for spectators, is one of only a few 3-court doubles facilities in the world and are experienced in staging world-class events. Most recently, they hosted the 2016 Canadian Mixed Doubles Championship with resounding success.

“The Toronto Cricket Skating & Curling Club is excited to host the 2017 Ridley Windows & Doors/Slaight Music Canadian Doubles Squash Championships, March 30 – April 2. Being the only private club in the world to have three hardball doubles courts, we look forward to welcoming the top doubles squash players from across North America to compete in the Open and age categories in this national championship” said Ryding.

Last year’s Championship featured an incredible turn out of over 260 athletes from three different countries. Participants competed in over 120 matches during the four-day event as they vied for the national title in fourteen divisions.

“2017 is going to be an exciting time for Canadian squash” said Squash Canada Executive Director, Dan Wolfenden. “Squash Canada is thrilled to have the Toronto Cricket, Skating & Curling Club host another national championship. The TCSCC has a very active and supportive doubles community which we are confident will contribute to the success of this event. Patrick and his team of dedicated staff and volunteers are not new to hosting and have staged many fantastic championships, so it is without a doubt they will do the same for the 2017 Canadian Doubles Championship.”
