



JEUX MONDIAUX DE MAÎTRES DOCUMENTS HISTORIQUES

Depuis 1985, l'International Masters Games Association (IMGA), une organisation à but non lucratif basée à Lausanne, en Suisse, et son prédécesseur, ainsi que les comités d'accueil, ont organisé les World Masters Games (WMG), World Winter Les Masters Games (WWMG), les European Masters Games (EMG) et les Americas Masters Games (AMG), avec des Jeux Masters Asie-Pacifique (APMG) prévus pour 2018. Les Jeux englobent un large éventail de sports. L'objectif de l'IMGA est de soutenir le mouvement olympique et de promouvoir la philosophie du «sport pour tous» de la Charte olympique. Les participants s'affrontent pour eux-mêmes - il n'y a pas de délégations dans les pays. Au-delà de la limite d'âge et de l'appartenance à l'organe directeur de ce sport, il n'y a pas d'exigences en matière de qualification de compétition.

Les catégories d'âge vont de 30 ans à 80 ans et plus pour le squash, qui a été inclus comme sport dans tous les WMG. Toronto a organisé les premiers Jeux mondiaux des maîtres en 1985 (WMG 1), Edmonton les a mis en scène en 2005 (WMG 6), la ville de Québec a organisé les Jeux d'hiver en 2015 (WWMG 2) et Vancouver toujours joué aux jeux d'été.
