



# BRITISH JUNIOR OPEN

## ELIGIBILITY AND SELECTION CRITERIA

Approved May 2026

### EVENT INFORMATION:

The 2027 British Junior Open will be hosted in *Birmingham, England January 2-6, 2027*.

According to the British Junior Open tournament guidelines, Squash Canada has the right to nominate a maximum of 5 male and 5 female athletes per age category for participation in the British Junior Open.

This policy therefore has been developed to outline the player eligibility requirements for Squash Canada endorsement and the process by which the association will decide which five players per division will receive endorsement in cases where there are more than five eligible players who express interest in participating in the event.

### PURPOSE:

This policy governs Squash Canada's selection of the athletes to compete in the British Junior Open.

### COMMUNICATION:

This Policy and any amendments to this Policy will be posted on the Squash Canada website.

### AUTHORITY:

The Board of Directors of Squash Canada has delegated the authority for selections and decisions under this Policy to the Junior/Athlete Pathway Committee.

### TIMELINE:

1. **By June 1, 2026** – The Expression of Interest (EOI) Registration will be released and communicated.
2. **By July 31, 2026** – Fill out an Expression of Interest [here](#) and pay a \$100 deposit (refundable if not selected).
3. **By August 20, 2026** – The first selections are communicated, as per the Selection Criteria below.
4. **Following the first NJC Platinum Event of 2026/27 Season** – Second selections will occur, as per the Selection Criteria
5. **By the given Event Registration Deadline** – Register for the event with the organizing group to be considered for selection. All athletes interested in participating should register for the event. The organizing group will, according to their policies, refund those athletes who do not get endorsed by Squash Canada.
6. **As soon as possible after selection** – Athletes will book flights or travel and complete any required training (ex. Canadian Safe Sport Education).
7. **Minimum one week prior to event** – Remaining full event payment. Estimated fee schedule will be indicated on the EOI registration page.
8. **1-3 weeks prior to event** – Expect a Team announcement via press release and a Team Canada meeting.

## ELIGIBILITY CRITERIA:

To be eligible for endorsement for the British Junior Open an athlete must:

1. Meet the respective age eligibility requirements;
2. Meet the relevant event criteria;
3. Be a Citizen of Canada, or a Permanent Resident of Canada, or be a resident of Canada for at least three (3) years continuously immediately preceding the event (provided that residents who are in Canada as students or who are temporary workers are not eligible). Notwithstanding the foregoing, a junior who is a student but who is residing in Canada with a parent who is a Permanent Resident of Canada or who has been a resident of Canada for at least three (3) years, will not be so disqualified;
4. Be a registered member in good standing of a Provincial/Territorial Squash Association and a player in good standing with Squash Canada
5. Be prepared to comply with any potential vaccination requirements;
6. Fill out an Expression of Interest by July 31, 2026 [here](#) and pay a \$100 deposit (refundable if not selected); and
7. Pay any required fees.

## SELECTION CRITERIA:

Athletes must register their Expression of Interest [HERE](#) by July 31, 2026 to be considered for selection by Squash Canada's Junior Athlete Pathway Committee.

Additionally, in order for an eligible player to be considered for selection to the British Junior Open, they **must** be duly registered for the event with the organizing group online by their deadline (DATE TBD).

In the case where:

1. Five or fewer eligible players have registered for a particular division, Squash Canada will endorse each of the entries.
2. More than five eligible players have registered for a particular division, Squash Canada will use the following criteria to select which eight athletes it will endorse:
  - a) The Top 3 eligible and registered athletes per division will be automatically endorsed based on NJC Rankings (U15, U17, U19) and Club Locker Squash Canada ratings (U11, U13) as of August 1, 2026.
  - b) The next 2 eligible and registered athletes will be discretionary selections by the Junior Athlete Pathway Committee. These discretionary selections will be made following the first NJC Platinum event of the season, and no later than October 15, 2026 whichever occurs earlier. Considerations will include NJC results, Club Locker Rating, age, head to heads, and any other possible factors.
  - c) All NJC Ranking/Club Locker rating ties will be broken by most recent head to head results between April 1, 2026 and the Junior Athlete Pathway Committee selection meeting. If no such head to heads exist, the athlete with the higher Club Locker rating in the previous period(s) will be considered the higher rated player.
  - d) If a player is not one of the five athletes endorsed in their age category, and the next oldest age division does not have five eligible players duly registered, the next highest ranked player(s) may request to be entered in the age division above theirs.

## REGISTRATION PROCESS:

Players wishing to participate at the British Junior Open must duly register on the event website as soon as possible to ensure participation, and by the internal England Squash registration deadline.

England Squash will refund the entry fee for players who registered but have not received endorsement from Squash Canada, in accordance with the applicable event refund policies. Refund eligibility will be subject to the respective governing body's event policies.

## REQUIREMENTS TO REMAIN ENDORSED AND FOR REMOVAL:

To remain eligible, all players endorsed by Squash Canada to compete in the British Junior Open, must adhere to each of the following:

- a) Maintain status as a member in good standing with their provincial/territorial squash association.
- b) Advise Squash Canada of any injury, illness, or other reason which has curtailed the athlete's training for more than 14 days. Squash Canada retains the right to request documentation to detail an injury or illness, and a medical practitioner's recommended timeline for return to training and competition, and/or to conduct further investigation.
- c) Sign a Squash Canada International Travel Waiver as a condition of endorsement.
- d) Fulfill all Squash Canada, host nation and/or host organizing committee travel, vaccination, or other health and safety requirements as many exist.
- e) Sign a Squash Canada - Athlete Agreement, if so requested.
- f) Demonstrate commitment to the event by maintaining training, fitness levels, and ensuring that competitive performance is maintained at a high standard appropriate for competition at the event.
- g) At all times, agree to acquaint themselves with, and strictly abide by the Squash Canada Code of Conduct, Discipline and Complaints Policy, Appeal Policy, and all other policies, rules, and regulations of the organization located [here](#). Athletes are also expected to support and uphold safe, respectful, and inclusive sport environments in alignment with Squash Canada's Safe Sport principles.

Failure to satisfy any of the above noted criteria may result in Squash Canada's withdrawal of endorsement for entry to the event at the sole discretion of the Interim Director of Athlete Development.

## WITHDRAWAL:

Any player who has received Squash Canada endorsement for entry to the British Junior Open who becomes injured, ill, or for whatever reason wishes to withdraw from the event, shall be required to notify Squash Canada at the earliest opportunity.

If such withdrawal opens a spot in an age division, the above selection criteria will be applied in sequence for the replacement player, who may be given a reasonable timeline by which to accept or reject the opportunity for Squash Canada endorsement for entry to the event.

## APPEALS:
