The ideal candidate will inspire, encourage, and create opportunities for Members to actively use the squash facilities. This role is particularly important during a transition period while the Club is under construction, ensuring continued engagement and a positive Member experience.

You bring a strong coaching background, excellent communication skills, and an outgoing, professional presence suited to a Member facing environment. You are a self starter with a strong member experience mindset, capable of building programming while developing strong relationships with Members.

A typical day includes delivering lessons and clinics, supporting Junior and Adult programming, assisting with league or event coordination, engaging with Members to encourage participation, and collaborating with the Head Squash Professional on program delivery and daily operations.

- Support Junior and Adult programming and encourage Member participation
- Assist with daily operations including scheduling and coordination
- Perform other related duties as assigned
